**Prompt:** Explain the extent to which Korea and Japan were similar in the period from 500-1200.

	<b>Belief Systems</b>	<b>Government</b>	<b>Relationship with China</b>
<b>Korea</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Confucianism elements from China impact elite</li> <li>● Confucianism lowers status of women → High restrictions on elite women</li> <li>● Buddhism impacted many people</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Dynasties = power moves through family</li> <li>● Politically independent and unified</li> <li>● Civil service examination (adopted from China) existed but was never as prominent as in China</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Paid taxes to the Chinese (usually in the form of products)</li> <li>● Positive trade and cultural relationship as long as taxes were paid</li> <li>● Borrowed from Chinese culture, especially among the elite</li> <li>● Emulated Chinese wealth</li> </ul>
<b>Japan</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Native beliefs and practices remain prominent - Shinto - focused on spirits associated with ancestry &amp; nature</li> <li>● Chinese Buddhism - different schools develop</li> <li>● Buddhism impacted art, architecture, education, medicine, etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● small aristocratic chiefdoms until 600s-900s</li> <li>● Never created strong centralized government</li> <li>● Feudalism develops - strong families with local military authorities</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Physically separated from China</li> <li>● Never successfully conquered by China → Influence was voluntary</li> <li>● Paid formal tribute until 900s</li> </ul>
<b>Similar or Different?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Somewhat similar - both have Buddhism</li> <li>● Primarily different - Confucianism vs. Shinto</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Very different - centralized vs non-centralized government</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Somewhat similar - both paid tribute</li> <li>● Differences- China had more influence in Korea &amp; conquered Korea</li> </ul>
<b>Thesis Statement</b>	Japan and Korea were not very similar in the period from 500-1200 because they had very different belief systems and styles of government. Although China influenced both places, Korea and Japan were impacted by China in different ways.
